## Taking the test

Laurel VEC provides free test sessions. No fees will be collected by RCVET at your session.

Examinations are conducted electronically using ExamTools.org, powered by HamStudy.





## After the test

After your test session and once the FCC receives the results from the VE team, you will receive two emails from the FCC.

The first will provide instructions for paying the FCC application fee.

The second will contain a link to your new or upgraded license.

If you haven't heard from the FCC within 5 business days of your test, check your spam folder.

Upgrading amateurs may begin using their new privileges immediately after the exam by adding "slash AG" or "slash AE" after their call when identifying to let others know that you're awaiting FCC recognition of your upgrade.

New amateurs must wait until their call shows up in the FCC ULS at fcc.gov/uls
