<u>New Business</u>: Ben Setzer discussed the letter we have received concerning Senate Bill 364 that proposes to ban all mobile radio use. The members have been provided a copy of a sample letter to complete and send to all three of our elected representatives requesting an exemption for Amateur Radio. Positive feedback has already been received from Ken Goodman in the House thanking for the "heads up" and stating that he will look into it.

Scott Whitaker displayed his new Kx2 (which is "on loan" from Butch :))) and his Chameleon P Loop antenna.

The Sec/Treas also reported that due to non-use the Post Office box had been closed in order to save the \$90 yearly rental fee. The only mail received in the past year and a half has been flyers and advertisements.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
