Butch Parris announced that a test session is scheduled for May 22, 2021 at 10:30a.m. at the Moose Lodge. Applicant's must have a FRN and a valid email. The FCC has not yet initiated the \$35.00 testing fee and there is no information as to how the fee will be collected even when activated. Roland Landry, Ben Setzer, WA4BCS, along with several others will be testing.

Club members signed a card on behalf of Mrs. Forrester, who is very ill, and Butch is mailing on behalf of the club.

New Business:

Butch reported that the remainder of Max Kearns, N4CGC, equipment has been sold.

Tim Martin presented club members with several options for purchasing ham radio club apparel from several vendors in town. The Secretary will summarize the various options and distribute to the members so a total number of items being bought from each vendor can be calculated. Members will be responsible for picking up their purchases once their requested items are ready.
